teachers may not be able to offer further opportunities.

Here is a little about what is happening in individual subjects

#### **ENGLISH**

English in Term Two is shaping up to be exciting for Kahikatea. Our Curriculum strand focus is Reading and within that characters will be explored. The over arching theme is survival and we are reading Hatchet, a very popular novel about a young thirteen year old surviving a plane crash, and his subsequent survival in the forests of Northern Canada. We will be having our own EOTC survival experience to link with the key ideas later in the term. Students will be given skills and a role play situation in our own native bush and will have some survival tasks to complete. Finding ways to link our learning with real

experiences and using our own unique surroundings enriches the learning for our students across all subjects and we look forward to another Big Day Out. The information and dates will be shared very soon. We are also deepening our understanding of character through Drama, and Mondays lessons will be combined with Totara and the learning will be through practical Drama skills. This will be team taught with Mr Mawson and Ms Rainham and is an exciting way to bring strengths and a practical understanding to our learning. This will also work to build self confidence and leads in nicely to our school speech competitions to be held on Wednesday June 3rd. Mr Ralph has has joined the teaching team for English and will be supporting the programme on Thursdays. We look forward to seeing our student's progress. #### **MATHS**

This Term Kahikatea have started on their journey of deepening their understanding of patterns in Algebra. Moving forward the foci of the term is to revise Algebraic Equations and Expressions and then apply these to how algebra is used and interpreted when creating patterns, identifying relationships in patterns and how to graph these relationships.

#### PE AND HEALTH

This term our PE and health programmes are very much intertwined. For health we are looking at influencing factors on sports participation and general wellness. Students are monitoring themselves on participation during PE and will be conducting an investigation into what factors positively and negatively influence students participation in sports and PE at KAS and what we can do to encourage participation levels. On Mondays we have a joined PE class with the year -8 class in which we are exploring a variety of activities and year 9-10s have some leadership opportunities with sharing expertise in their areas of sporting interest. During Kahikatea's individual PE lessons we are focusing on skills development with badminton as the context. Throughout all PE lessons students are monitoring and assessing their own and others effort and participation levels and identifying what the

influencing factors are for any given activity.

#### SCIENCE

Science this term will largely focus on the science fair projects. Science fair is a time when students can form their own question to study with the support and resourcing of the science department. The local competition will be at Buller High school at the end of this term with the best projects going through to the West Coast science fair at Greymouth High School in the second week of term 3.

#### SOCIAL STUDIES

Due to the jam-packed nature of last term, students' have spent the first 2 weeks completing their term 1 surfing unit to a suitable standard. It is a culmination of the integrated PE and Social Studies unit and the presentations are looking fantastic.

The rest of this term we will be investigating NZ's migration history which will run alongside the history lessons they have already begun on NZ first encounters.

We will be looking at push and pull factors for emigration and migration and exploring NZ's rich multicultural population You can expect questions from your children regarding your own families national and global movements.

#### HARD MATERIALS

Kahikatea will be finishing their upholstered foot stools early this term. Our next project will be working with Pewter. Pewter is an alloy with a low melting point which makes it ideal for casting. The students will form a design, cut it out of MDF to make a mold then pour molten pewter into it. Once cooled the pewter can be worked with hand tools and sandpaper to create a beautiful piece of jewellery or a key ring.
