Anna King continues to work with Totara class Thursdays LB1-A managing the students spelling and literacy programmes. During LB3 Anna will be teaching Geography, one of her specialist subjects. Students have been given the choice of topic that links to an aspect of Geography, with the option to gain NCEA Level 1 credits.

Here is a little about what is happening in individual subjects

LITERACY

Imagine deciding what goes on the radio. How would you choose to fill the airwaves? How would you balance the wishes of the audience and your own personal tastes?

This Term Totara students will explore these and other questions which give them the opportunity to produce a series of 20-30 minute live to air radio shows that include:

- News Bulletins
- · Weather forecasts
- Biography of a musician (music and information about the artist)
- Pre-recorded interviews of local community members (Potentially these are shared with other local Radio Stations)
- Advertising- Jingles, Posters, Email notifications

Please ask your children to see their 'Radio Show Project' workbook so you can gain some insight into what is going on at school.

Totara class will be travelling from school to the studio (behind Vinnies Café) and back by minivan commencing from week 4 (7th of November) every Thursday and Friday between 11:30 and 12:45. You can support your child by tuning into Karamea Radio 107.5 FM, or by coming down to Vinnies café where you can watch them broadcast their show from the comfort of a couch while nursing a latte!
